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ADVISORY FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:

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(BOISE) – Streets adjacent to the Idaho State Capitol are slated for full or partial closures beginning June 25, 2007 to expedite the restoration and expansion of Idaho's grandest building, the state Capitol. The Idaho State Capitol Commission will discuss details of the affected lanes and the duration of the project during its June commission meeting. The June meeting begins at 9:30 am, Wednesday, June 20 at the Idaho History Center.


The Capitol Commission and Ada County Highway District would like to alert Capitol Mall motorists that as the Highway District traffic professionals begin modifying traffic controls this week, some of the lane closures may occur as soon as practical to make room for the expanded Capitol work fence expansion on all sides. The following lane closures occur no later than next Monday:

- State Street will remain open but will be narrowed to one lane in each direction through the State Capitol area.
- Jefferson will be closed between 6th and 8th except for the traffic on the west leg of the wye. The east leg of the wye will be closed. The west sidewalk, parking and the adjacent lane on 6th between State and Jefferson will be closed.
- The east sidewalk, parking and the adjacent lane on 8th between State and Jefferson will be closed.
- The sidewalks adjacent to the Capitol block will be closed for construction but the sidewalks on the opposite sides of the streets – State, 6th, Jefferson, and 8th will remain open and functional.

The Ada County Highway District is re-striping State Street, modifying the signal at 8th and State, and changing signal timing as necessary because of the strategic importance and long term nature of the work. Jacobson-Hunt Joint Venture, the construction manager-at-risk, will provide construction traffic controls, arrow boards, and informational signs to provide area drivers with advance warning and project status.

The thirty-month renovation, restoration, rehabilitation, and expansion project is the culmination of over eight years of effort by the Idaho Capitol Commission. The \$120 million project ensures complete occupancy of the building by the legislature and state officials for another century. The Capitol restoration team has begun a very tight schedule, closing the Capitol until the beginning of the 2010 legislative session.
